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
Cute frogs!

- 3. Write two or three sentences about your frog.



Cut out these pictures. Put them in order to show how frogs grow. Write about each stage.



Instructions Ask children to number the four cut- outs. After they have written about each picture, staple to make a mini book.

Spinning frogs

Colour the pictures. Cut out the two circles. Paste them together. Push a straw between the pictures. Rub the straw in your hands to make the pictures spin.



Instructions Ask children to make sure the pictures are upside down to each other. Ask them to leave a little space at the bottom to push a straw through and give each child a straw. Ask them to spin the straw and watch the picture.
