Possible literacy focus
Recalling a sequence of events in a narrative.
Identifying plot features, such as orientation (who, what, where, when), problem (what went wrong) and resolution (how the problem was fixed).

This book is about a boy who daydreams about being famous. He becomes famous for a day when he saves a rare cat and ends up in the newspaper.


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# Newspaper headlines
