

#### **Deserts**

Topic: Our marvellous world
Curriculum link: Earth and Beyond; Environment
Text type: Report
Reading level: 11
Word count: 226
High-frequency words: a, is, where, it, there, of, and, the, at, can, get, all, with, have, down, these, or, into, from, this, in, for
Vocabulary: desert, rocky, stony, sandy, wind, water, polar
Possible literacy focus:
Identifying the key ideas from each double-page spread.
Understanding the appropriate use of generalisations in report writing.

#### **Follow-up activities**

#### **Summary chart**

Ask the children to re-read the book *Deserts*, then fill in a summary chart.

Type of desert	Features

Discuss the information in the chart. Talk about how displaying information in this way differs from the way information is given in a book.

#### Where to now?

Ask the children to write a list of questions about things that they would still like to find out about deserts. They then discuss and list different ways they could try to find out this information. Supply the children with a range of factual books, computer software and cached web sites about deserts to support their research. Ask the children to report back as they find answers to the questions posed.

#### **Identifying main ideas**

Ask the children to re-read the book, pausing at the end of each double-page spread to discuss the main idea presented. Write the main ideas found on a chart.

Re-read the chart and ask the children what the main idea of the book was.

You will need:

small cardboard box, craft glue, sand, small pebbles, small leaves, cotton wool, bark, coloured paper, card, pen

- 1. Make a model of a desert in the box.
- 2. Write a sentence about the desert you have made.

- 3. Draw what these deserts look like.
